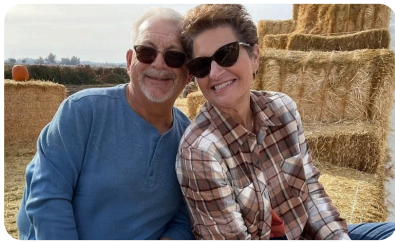

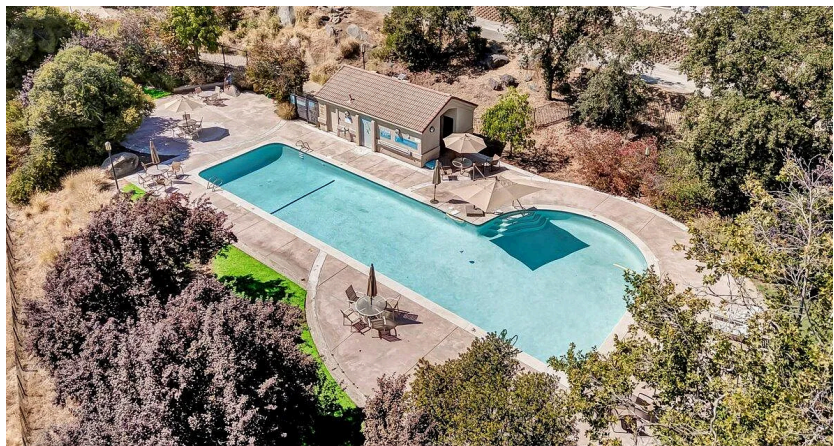

Like wasps, they die off in the fall, and nest somewhere new the following year.

Unlike wasps, they have a very mild temperament.

The nest can stay, and a colony of useful, docile pollinators gets to finish out its lifecycle, while working to beautify our neighborhood!

Sago Palms and Pet Safety

Did you know Sago Palms are highly toxic to animals? Sago Palms are beautiful but highly toxic to dogs and cats. All parts of the plant – especially the seeds – can cause serious illness if eaten, even in small amounts.

Please keep an eye on pets outdoors and clear away any fallen seeds or debris. If you think your pet may have nibbled on one, contact your veterinarian right away. When updating landscaping, consider pet-friendly alternatives to keep our furry friends safe.
